Beware of the Darkness

Ghouls just want to have a hauntingly good time. This Halloween check out these sites around the state that have reported paranormal activity.

A popular gravestone at the Salt Lake City Cemetery is that of Lilly Gray, whose marker reads 'Victim of the Beast 666.' The most popular speculation on the odd epitaph is that it's a reference to her husband Elmer blaming the government for Lilly's death. This Google marker will help lead you to her gravesite.

Located in the Uinta Basin, Skinwalker Ranch is a hotspot for UFO sightings and strange unexplained phenomna. A 'skinwalker' is a shape-shifting witch of Navajo legend. Multiple books and TV shows have explored the happenings at the ranch. Skinwalker Ranch is closed to the public.

The lines blur between halloween thrill attraction and real haunted house at two local sites. Alyslum 49 in Tooele is an intense fullcontact haunted attraction during the fall, but paranormal ghost tours are held the remainder of the year. The Old Tooele Hospital was built in 1873 and hauntings include a ghost known as Wes who who suffered from Alzheimers in life, and a nurse named Maria who guards what is believed to be a portal. Fear Factory in Salt Lake was built on the former site of the Portland Cement Company. Many workers met their deaths over the years and actors for the haunted attraction have declined to return after spooky encounters. Both of these sites have been profiled by the show Ghost Adventures.
