Blooming in Winter

Brighten up your home during the gray of winter with these indoor plants.

[African Violet](#)

Produces small, velvety flowers in blue, purple, pink, white, or other colors.

[Holiday Cactus](#)

The Easter cactus typically booms in late winter or early spring while the Christmas cactus and Thanksgiving cactus bloom earlier in the winter. To produce buds, they need shorter days and cooler night temperatures.

[Orchids](#)

Most orchids bloom once or twice a year but others bloom more. Available in a wide variety of colors.

[Amaryllis](#)

Produces dramatic trumpet-shaped blooms in bold reds, pinks, and whites.

[Primrose](#)

Cheerful clusters of colorful flowers in almost every color.

[Anthurium](#)

Features heart-shaped spathes in vivid reds, whites or pinks.

[Hyacinthus](#)

Bright-colored fragrant flowers that bloom in dense bulbous clusters.

[Kalanchoe](#)

Small four-petaled flowers bloom in dense clusters.

Stain Slayer Guide

Spills happen, but stains don't have to stick around. Check out this guide to kicking common messes to the curb.

Wine: Blot, rinse with cold water from the back, then cover with salt or baking soda before washing cold. For set stains, soak in cold water with oxygen bleach first.

Coffee/Tea: Rinse with cold water, apply liquid detergent, and let sit before washing. Dab with white vinegar if needed.

Blood: Use cold water only and rinse or soak immediately, then treat with hydrogen peroxide (light fabrics) or bar soap before laundering.

Grease/Oil: Sprinkle baking soda or cornstarch to absorb, brush off, then work in dish soap and wash warm (if fabric allows).

Tomato Sauce: Scrape excess, rinse cold from the back, treat with dish soap, and wash cold.

Makeup: Blot with micellar water or remover, apply dish soap or detergent, then wash cold.

Grass: Rub liquid detergent directly into the stain and wash; use a little rubbing alcohol for tougher spots. Many baseball parents swear by Fels-Naptha soap.

Ink: Place a paper towel underneath, dab with rubbing alcohol or sanitizer, blot until it lifts, then wash.

Deodorant Marks: Rub with a damp cloth and white vinegar or gently rub the fabric against itself to lift residue.
